

Extract from the Board of Directors' Resolution of **14 May 2026**

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The University uses language that respects gender differences. Where used, the masculine form is intended to refer inclusively to all people, regardless of their gender identity, and is used solely to ensure the text is as easy to read and flows as smoothly as possible.

At its meeting of 14 May 2026, the Board of Directors approved the student fee structure for the 2026/2027 academic year.

Section 1 – Student contributions: scope of application

Under Law 232/2016, students enrolled on Bachelor's degree programmes, Master's degree programmes, single-cycle Master's degree programmes and postgraduate specialisation programmes contribute towards the costs of teaching, research and administrative services through an "all-inclusive annual fee".

Section 2 – Student contributions

In addition to the annual all-inclusive fee, all enrolled students are required to pay stamp duty, the regional tax for the right to higher education referred to in Article 3, paragraphs 20–23, of Law No. 549 of 28 December 1995, and insurance cover.

The all-inclusive fee is calculated with reference to the type of programme, the year of study attended (for the purposes of calculating years of enrolment at the University, reference is made to the year of first enrolment, including cases of transfer from a different programme than the one currently attended), the student's income and asset situation, and academic merit, in accordance with the principles of fairness, graduality and progressivity. Additional fees are also provided for services supplied upon student request for individual needs.

Section 3 – Composition of the fee

UNIMORE provides for the payment of the fee in four instalments within predefined deadlines, non-compliance with which results in the application of progressive late payment surcharges. For students enrolling in the first year of a Bachelor's degree, a single-cycle Master's degree, a two-year Master's degree, or specialist schools, the first instalment comprises the following items:

- regional tax
- stamp duty
- insurance premiums

The all-inclusive fee, as well as any fees for services provided at the students' request, will be applied to instalments following the first one in the manner set out below.

For students who enrol in a year other than their first in the 2026/2027 academic year, the first instalment will consist of the following items:

- regional tax
- stamp duty
- insurance premiums
- all-inclusive contribution
- any fees for services provided at students' request

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Payment of the first instalment formalises enrolment in the academic year.

International students whose enrolment for 2026/2027 is processed via the University portal of the Ministry of Education, Universities and Research shall, for enrolment purposes, initially be required to pay only fixed fees, subject to recalculation and adjustment of university contributions following the issuance of an entry visa to the national territory;

The subsequent instalments consist of the following items:

- all-inclusive fee;
- any fees for services provided at students' request;
- any applicable surcharges.

Section 4 Fee payment deadlines and methods

Payment of the fee must be made in accordance with the procedures laid down by the University and exclusively via the pagoPA system.

No further instalment options are available for payment of the fees.

b) **Late payment surcharges**

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The surcharge for late payment of university tuition fee instalments, from the day after the due date and within the first fifteen days, is EUR 30; after 15 days from the due date, it is EUR 70; these amounts are one-off charges for each individual instalment.

For students wishing to enrol on degree programmes for which the university has established a quota-based admission system, any late payment surcharge will be applied from the second instalment onwards, as – in accordance with the deadlines set out in the call for applications for admission to quota-based programmes – late payment of the first instalment results in exclusion from enrolment on the programme.

Selection 5 Determination of the maximum all-inclusive fee payable

a) Definition of a student within the standard programme duration or behind schedule for the purposes of university fees:

For the sole purposes of determining university fees, students are defined as follows:

Regular students = students enrolled in their university for a number of academic years less than or equal to the normal duration of their degree programme, increased by one

Students beyond the regular duration = from the second year beyond the standard duration of the degree programme.

(for the purposes of counting years of enrolment in the University, reference is made to the year of first enrolment, even if coming from a course other than the one currently attended)

b) The full amounts (maximum and including fixed charges) for students enrolled on Bachelor's degree programmes, single-cycle Master's degree programmes and Master's degree programmes are set out below, and the rates applicable to the all-inclusive fee are shown in **Table 1**:

They are exempt from university fees and are only required to pay the fixed items provided for in Section 3.

Section A: TYPES OF EXEMPTION FROM THE ALL-INCLUSIVE FEE

Pursuant to Law No. 232/2016 and Article 9 of Legislative Decree No. 68/2012, in order to guarantee the Right to Education, UNIMORE allows its students to apply for full or partial exemption from, or a reduction of, the all-inclusive fee on the basis of the financial circumstances of the student's family unit, as assessed through the ISEE indicator.

A further element contributing to the determination of the amount payable by the student as the all-inclusive fee for enrolment in the academic year is the student's family unit's financial and asset situation, together with the number of university credits (ECTS) obtained during the period from 11

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August 2025 to 10 August 2026, as well as the submission of an online application requesting the application of the benefits provided for under the relevant calls for applications.

Section 6 Determination of fees for students eligible for full and partial exemption

a) Full Exemption

Students who are eligible for full exemption from enrolment fees will be required to pay the fixed charges set out in the table below:

Section 7 Exemption for the No Tax Area – pursuant to Law 232/2016

Full Exemption

Pursuant to Law No. 232/2016, students enrolled (excluding students enrolled in Schools of Specialisation, which are governed separately below) are exempt from payment of the annual all-inclusive fee if they jointly meet the following requirements:

- belonging to a family unit whose ISEE indicator is less than or equal to €30,000.00;
- being enrolled in a degree programme for a number of academic years equal to or less than the standard duration of the programme, plus one additional year;
- in the case of enrolment in the second academic year: having obtained, by 10 August 2026, at least 10 university credits during the first year;
- in the case of enrolment in subsequent academic years: having obtained, in the twelve months preceding 10 August 2026 prior to the relevant enrolment, at least 25 university credits.

In the case of first-time enrolment in the first academic year, the only requirement to be met is that set out in section a) above.

In order to benefit from the exemption pursuant to Law No. 232/2016, enrolled students must submit an online application in accordance with the conditions and deadlines set out in the Call for Applications for the Right to Higher Education benefits

Section 8 – Exemptions pursuant to Legislative Decree No. 68/2012

Pursuant to Legislative Decree No. 68/2012, UNIMORE grants full exemption from the all-inclusive fee to the following categories of enrolled students:

- students with an officially assessed disability of 66% or above, or with recognition of a disability status pursuant to Article 3(1) of Law No. 104 of 5 February 1992;
- international students who are beneficiaries of an annual scholarship awarded by the Italian Government;
- students who meet the eligibility requirements for the award of the Er-Go scholarship;
- students covered by any agreements or conventions providing for exemption from the all-inclusive fee;

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- e) full exemption, pursuant to Article 1, paragraphs 563 and 564 of Law No. 266/2005, for children of victims of duty-related service;
- f) full exemption, pursuant to Law No. 206/2004, for children of victims of terrorism and victims of massacres perpetrated for terrorist purposes.

Pursuant to Legislative Decree No. 68/2012, UNIMORE grants partial exemption from the all-inclusive fee to the following category of students:

- g) students with an officially assessed disability ranging from 46% to 65%.

To benefit from the exemptions provided for under Legislative Decree No. 68/2012, students must submit an online application in accordance with the conditions and deadlines set out in the Call for Applications for the Right to Higher Education benefits.

Students with disabilities who already benefit from full or partial exemption from the all-inclusive fee and who intend to request, for the 2026/2027 academic year only, confirmation of such full or partial exemption are not required to submit an online application, as this information will be acquired ex officio (whereas students interested in other benefits must complete the application). Students with disabilities enrolling for the first time in a degree programme (first-year students of Bachelor's degree programmes, single-cycle Master's degree programmes or two-year Master's degree programmes), or transferring from another University, are instead required to submit an online application.

The right to full or partial exemption must be exercised exclusively by submitting the specific online application by the established deadlines. If an eligible student has not submitted a formal application within the required time limits, the relevant benefits may only be granted upon submission of an application for extraordinary financial assistance. In such cases, the fee benefit shall be granted from the date on which the University administration formally became aware of the documentation proving entitlement.

Section 9 – Top Student Exemption

1. Full "TOP STUDENT" exemption for particularly deserving students residing in a municipality located outside the Emilia-Romagna Region;
2. Partial "TOP STUDENT" exemption for particularly deserving students residing in a municipality within the Emilia-Romagna Region.

To benefit from the "TOP STUDENT" exemptions, students must submit an online application in accordance with the conditions and deadlines set out in the Call for Applications for the Right to Higher Education benefits.

Point 10 - Full exemption pursuant to Article 30 of Law 118/71

Full exemption, pursuant to Article 30 (Exemption from school and university fees for persons with civil disabilities) of Law No. 118/1971, is granted to students who are children of recipients of disability pensions. To benefit from this type of exemption, students must be part of the family unit of the person receiving the disability pension, and their Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator (ISEE) and Equivalent Asset Situation Indicator (ISPE) must not exceed the thresholds established for eligibility for the scholarship.

To benefit from the full exemption pursuant to Article 30 of Law No. 118/1971, students must submit an online application in accordance with the conditions and deadlines set out in the Call for Applications for the Right to Higher Education benefits.

Section 11 – Exemption from payment of the 3rd and 4th instalments of the all-inclusive fee for graduating students in their first year beyond the standard duration

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Students who enrol in the 2026/2027 academic year in the first year beyond the standard duration of Bachelor's degree programmes, single-cycle Master's degree programmes or two-year Master's degree programmes, and who complete their final examination at the first available graduation session of the 2026/2027 academic year, shall be exempt from payment of the 3rd and 4th instalments of the all-inclusive fee. For the purposes of calculating the number of years of enrolment (in cases of transfer, change of programme, reactivation of studies, repeat years, temporary interruptions, etc.), the duration shall be calculated with reference to the year of first enrolment.

Section B: TYPES OF REDUCTIONS OF THE ALL-INCLUSIVE FEE

Section 12 – Reduction of the all-inclusive fee for students enrolled on a part-time basis

Students enrolled in degree programmes on a part-time basis are entitled to a 40% reduction in university fees, whereas the fixed items comprising the fee structure remain unchanged. The reduction is valid for one academic year. Students enrolled in programmes on a part-time basis may benefit from the concessions available to all students.

Section 13 – Reduction of the all-inclusive fee

Students belonging to a household whose ISEE does not exceed EUR 60,000.00 may apply for the adjustment of the all-inclusive fee, which is determined according to the rates and the deductible indicated in **Table 1**

No adjustment of the all-inclusive fee shall be granted for ISEE values exceeding the maximum threshold of EUR 60,000.00, in the absence of submission of the online application requesting the reduction, or where the online application has not been correctly submitted. In such cases, the student shall be required to pay the maximum amount.

Categories and determination of minimum amounts (**Table 1**):

Category A-B – NO TAX AREA exemption (Merit Bands 1, 2 and 3): Students are included in this category if they are first-year students or students enrolled in subsequent years, belong to a family unit whose ISEE indicator is less than or equal to EUR 30,000.00, have been enrolled at the University for a number of academic years equal to or less than the standard duration of the programme plus one additional year and, if enrolled in years subsequent to the first, have obtained the required number of university credits.

Category C – Students BEYOND THE STANDARD DURATION with merit (Merit Band 4): Students are included in this category if they have been enrolled at the University for a number of academic years exceeding the standard duration of the programme plus one additional year and have obtained the required number of university credits. The applicable fee rate is increased by 50%, with a minimum fee of EUR 200.00.

Category D – Students WITHIN THE STANDARD DURATION without merit (Merit Bands 5 and 6): Students are included in this category if they have been enrolled at the University for a number of academic years equal to or less than the standard duration of the programme plus one additional year and have not obtained the required number of university credits. The applicable fee rate is applied, subject to a minimum fee of EUR 500.00.

Category E – Students BEYOND THE STANDARD DURATION without merit (Merit Band 7): Students are included in this category if they have been enrolled at the University for a number of academic years exceeding the standard duration of the programme plus one additional year and have not obtained the required number of university credits. The applicable fee rate is increased by 50%, with a minimum fee of EUR 700.00.

Students enrolled in Schools of Specialisation are also included in this category (E – Merit Band 7),

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subject to the same calculation rules and with a minimum fee of EUR 700.00.

To benefit from the reduction of the all-inclusive fee, students must submit an online application in accordance with the conditions and deadlines set out in the Call for Applications for the Right to Higher Education benefits.

Section 14 – Fees for University Master's programmes and professional specialisation and continuing education courses, and teacher training courses

The fees for enrolment in University Master's programmes, professional specialisation and continuing education courses and training courses, as well as teacher training courses, are governed by specific resolutions. Insurance cover for Master's programmes and specialisation courses is provided by analogy with the cover already established, based on the nature of the risks arising from the activities carried out as part of the courses.

Section 15 – Fees for enrolment in PhD programmes

The fees for enrolment in PhD programmes for the 2026/2027 academic year are determined as follows:

For students enrolled on postgraduate medical training programmes not listed in the table above, insurance cover is included in the postgraduate training contract.

For students enrolled in healthcare specialisation schools not listed in the table above, insurance cover is included in the specialist training contract.

For enrolment purposes, students enrolled in Schools of Specialisation are required to pay the fixed items (regional tax, stamp duty and insurance policies), while the remaining fee items are collected through subsequent instalments.

Section C: FURTHER DEFINITIONS RELATING TO FEES

Section 17 – Fees for Officer Cadets of the Military Academy

The following concessions on the all-inclusive fee are provided for Officer Cadets of the Modena Military Academy (pursuant to the agreement signed between UNIMORE and the Modena Military Academy) enrolled in degree programmes:

- Attending Officer Cadets:** all-inclusive fee of EUR 701.33, plus the fixed items applied according to the degree programme in which the student is enrolled.
- Non Attending Officer Cadets:** all-inclusive fee of EUR 427.33, plus the fixed items applied according to the degree programme in which the student is enrolled.

Section 18 – Fees for the Emilia-Romagna Regional Command of the Guardia di Finanza

The following concessions on the all-inclusive fee are provided for students enrolled in degree programmes and belonging to the Emilia-Romagna Regional Command of the **Guardia di Finanza**, as provided for and governed by the relevant agreement:

- a 35% reduction in university fees;
- a 35% reduction for enrolment in individual courses;

The Agreement has a four-year duration and shall apply from the 2025/2026 academic year onwards.

Section 19 – Students in detention

On the basis of the agreement entered into by the University with the Department of Prison Administration, students in detention are entitled to full exemption from university fees.

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Section 20 – Fees not exceeding EUR 12.00

No collection is required for fees not exceeding EUR 12.00, and the student is exempt from payment thereof.

Section 21 – Specific fees (services upon individual request)

Pursuant to Article 1, paragraph 260 of Law No. 232/2016, fees are established for services provided upon the student's request for individual needs and are set out in **Table 2**.

Section 22 – Fees for individual courses

For enrolment in individual courses, the fee is set at EUR 200.00 per individual course, plus stamp duty and insurance cover.

Section 23 – Provisions concerning stamp duty

Stamp duty is collected in accordance with the provisions set out in the Circular issued by the Italian Revenue Agency, as indicated in **Table 3**.

Section 24 – Refunds of university fees

Refunds of university fees shall be made in accordance with the cases set out in **Table 4**. No refunds shall be made where the amount to be refunded is equal to or less than EUR 12.00.

Section 25 – Fees for students enrolled following an order of the competent authority or following the scrolling of ranking lists for nationally restricted-access programmes

University fees for students enrolled in programmes for which enrolment has been granted following an order of the competent authority or as a result of late scrolling of ranking lists for available places, shall be determined on the basis of the all-inclusive fee due for the current academic year in which the student gains access to or is admitted to the programme.

Section 26 – Fees paid for enrolment in a subsequent academic year where enrolment is cancelled due to completion of the degree in the previous academic year

The payment made for enrolment in an academic year which, following completion of the degree in the previous academic year, results in a refund situation (due to cancellation of enrolment), may, at the student's request, be transferred and applied towards enrolment in a UNIMORE degree programme in the following academic year, subject to any necessary adjustments or balance payments.

Section 27 – Fixed-rate fee (Flat Tax) for international students (non-EU)

*The university fee for international students (non-EU) who are enrolled or intend to enrol on degree programmes and specialisation schools and who derive their income and assets exclusively from abroad – (Law No. 232 of 11 December 2006, paragraph 261: "in the case of students who are nationals of non-European Union Member States and who are not resident in Italy, for whom the calculation of the ISEE for their household is inapplicable pursuant to Article 8(5) of the Regulation issued by the President of the Council of Ministers on 5 December 2013, No. 159, the amount of the annual all-inclusive grant is determined by the individual state universities"), is calculated on the basis of an annual indicator determined by the per capita income generated in the country of origin and adjusted to PPP (Purchasing Power Parity) by the World Bank, using a notional ISEE (Country ISEE) (**Table 5**). International students (from outside the EU) who have income or assets abroad may, as an*

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alternative to submitting translated and legalised documentation, choose to be placed in the ISEE bracket corresponding to the notional ISEE, i.e. the country-specific ISEE (**Table 6**). Students who apply for their ISEE bracket to be determined using the notional ISEE, or "Country ISEE", will be subject to the fixed fee set out below:

Section 28 – Fees for attendance of the open semester for admission to the single-cycle Master's degree programmes in Medicine and Surgery and Dentistry and Dental Prosthetics

Attendance at the open semester offered by UNIMORE, intended for admission to the single-cycle Master's degree programmes in Medicine and Surgery and Dentistry and Dental Prosthetics, is subject to payment of a fee determined according to the financial and asset situation of the student's family unit. The amount, fee bands and payment arrangements will be established in the Call for Applications for admission to the single-cycle Master's degree programmes in Medicine and Surgery and Dentistry and Dental Prosthetics for the 2026/2027 academic year
